ORDER

This is an appeal under Section 19(3) of RTI Act, 2005 received from Miss Bengia Mama for non-furnishing of below mentioned information by the PIO, o/o the District Fishery Development Officer, Yupia, Papum Pare District (A.P) as sought for by her under section 6(1) (Form-A) of RTI Act, 2005 vide her application dated 02.09.2024.

f) Period for which information asked for: 2020-2021

This appeal is heard today on 23.05.2025 for the 4th time, the earlier three times being on 22.01.2025, 03.04.2025 and 25.04.2025.

On 25.0.4.2025, wherein the PIO nor any of his representative was present but for the appellants, Advocate Shri Dope Ori was present, this Commission, upon hearing the Counsel for the appellant, had directed the PIO to furnish to the appellant with legible and colour photograph of the implemented projects.

In today's hearing the PIO is represented by Advocate Shri Kipa Rore and the appellant is represented by the same Counsel, Shri Dope Ori.

The Ld. Counsel for the PIO submitted that the information sought for by the appellants have already been furnished and that the photograph of the implemented project has also been recorded in the geotagged report which has also been furnished to the appellant. In this regard the Ld. Counsel has also submitted a written statement. The Ld. Counsel, on the other hand, contended that his client has no complaints regarding the rest of the documents she has received from the PIO but reiterated her demand for a clear, legible and colour photograph of the implemented projects.

This Commission, upon hearing the parties as above, deems it appropriate to direct the PIO to provide the photograph of the implemented projects in colour and in legible form to the appellant within 2(two) weeks and the appellant shall, within two days thereafter or of the receipt of the same, whichever is earlier, intimate this Commission for further order.
